

Kankakee Community College

Kankakee Community College's (KCC) main campus is located on 178 acres on the southern edge of Kankakee. Situated on the tree-lined banks of the Kankakee River, the campus is surrounded by agricultural land and the scenic Kankakee Conservation Area. The college is easily accessible from Interstate 57. The KCC Iroquois Country Satellite Center in Watseka provides a college presence in the southern portion of District 520. The college also has extension centers throughout the district. KCC offers transfer programs that provide the first two years of a bachelor's degree and career or occupational programs that provide training for immediate entry into the workforce. Numerous continuing education courses are offered to area residents each semester. The Division of Adult and Community Education offers Adult Basic Education and General Education Development programs for adults wanting to complete their secondary education.

- More than 60% of KCC students plan to transfer to a four-year college or university. Typically, KCC students who transfer to four-year colleges and universities earn higher GPAs at the four-year school than the students who began there as freshmen.
